Department Highlights

Concealed Weapons Permits

Issuance of Madison residents' concealed weapons permits will now be handled by the State Police. The outstanding applications were delivered to the State Police on Thursday, September 24th.

Personnel

Joseph Mitchell retired after 26 years of service with Madison. Joe's last day with the division was September 19th and we wish him well. The division is seeking to fill the two open deputy positions. The advertisement closed on September 27th, applications were reviewed, and interviews are scheduled for Tuesday, October 13th. Currently there are seven applicants to be interviewed. Town Manager Tim Curtis is participating in the interview process.

Executive Secretary Slate returned to work on September 23rd. She has accepted the position of Executive Assistant working in the Sheriff's Office administrative group. The position for the Madison Division was posted on Tuesday, October 6th.

Follow-up

The deputy assigned to follow-up is currently filling patrol shifts until the openings are filled and new-hires are able to patrol.

Patrol Coverage

Two vacant positions have required the division to move to a temporary change in scheduling. The three full time patrol deputies are on call out during the overnight hours. This schedule became effective on September 20th. The call-out hours fluctuate between 12AM – 6AM and 2AM – 8AM. During weekends a deputy is always on patrol until 2AM. Between September 20th and September 30th there were 5 call outs during the overnight hours. The call-outs involved a suspicious activity complaint, burglary of a residential garage, a single vehicle accident with an intoxicated driver, a single vehicle accident involving a deer, and a resident's request for an accident report.

Training / Other

Eric Bronson trained with the rural division on executing drug search warrants and has been attending monthly intelligence meetings. The intelligence meetings are a key resource for investigations and help agencies partner in solving crimes.

The Madison Division participated in the Drug Take Back Event sponsored by the Maine Sheriff's Association on Saturday, September 26th. This division collected almost 50 pounds worth of unused or expired medications. The county collected 459 pounds of unused or expired medications in total during this event.
